Through statewide engagement, the study will uncover gaps, surface opportunities, and lay the groundwork for a more connected and responsive capital system to power Arizona's economic future.

What This Study Will Deliver

A Capital Map of Arizona: A clear, data-informed picture of how investment is distributed across housing, nonprofits, and small businesses to guide smarter, more strategic decision-making.

Spotlight Opportunities for Growth: Identify regions and sectors with untapped potential, helping funders and institutions align resources where they'll matter most.

Build a Shared Vision Across Sectors: Unite voices from finance, philanthropy, government, and community around a coordinated strategy for investment and impact.

Deliver an Investment Playbook: Transform insights into practical strategies for funding, legislation, and systems-level reform, so leaders can move from insight to action.

Strengthen Arizona's Capital Ecosystem: Lay the groundwork for a more responsive, coordinated, and resilient capital infrastructure to support long-term statewide growth.

Seed a Statewide Investment Model: Establish the foundation for a future mechanism that aligns public and private capital to invest in Arizona's greatest assets; its people and communities.
